Back by popular demand, Gibbs Smith, Publisher is releasing an updated and revised edition of *100 Years of Western Wear* (\$19.95, ISBN 0-87905-591-X, 160 pages, 135 color photographs, 50 black and white photographs, April 2001). In addition to a fresh cover, this edition also includes an expanded final chapter chronicling western fashion from the 1990s right up to the present, 25 new photographs showcasing the latest duds, and profiles of some up-and-coming designs of small couturiers.

Unchanged is the way 100 Years of Western Wear beautifully illustrates the progression of cowboy dressing — from the birth of Levi's and the entrenchment of the cowboy boot to the costumes of rodeo riders and movie stars, to the polyester play world of the seventies, flashy country-western stage wear, and the boutique clothing of the late 1900s. All in all, 100 Years of Western Wear captures the heart and soul of a unique American style.

This style is sometimes sophisticated, sometimes sassy, but always sexy. Who could forget Roy Rogers in his stage wear, or Garth Brooks in a pair of his tight jeans and one of his Mo Betta shirts? Even the material girl has been sporting the glam-western look recently. Just another affirmation that western wear is hotter than ever!
